

A day in the life of an Outpatient Physician

1

GET STARTED

I view the day's appointments on a schedule, and, when a patient arrives, I can quickly jump into their electronic chart. I can access patient information securely from various devices - whenever and wherever I need it.

2

REVIEW

I review patient history and up-to-date content from the clinic, hospital stays, and ED visits - all in one spot! The Scheduled Outpatient lists in the acute setting will display indicators for testing done on the same account but not from previous encounters.

3

UPDATE

I add, edit, and resolve items on a patient's problem list to ensure an accurate representation of their health. I can also view and update the medication list from visit to visit.

4

ORDER

I enter orders directly into the system which improves accuracy and turnaround time. Peer-reviewed, evidence-based order sets improve efficiency and provide standardized care. Interaction checking and other safety checks prompt me if there are any concerns. Orders will be immediately available and distributed to carry out.

5

DOCUMENT

I complete clinical documentation electronically using tools that increase efficiency - voice to text software (Dragon), templates, the sharing of documentation components between providers, and clinical decision support tools. Electronic documentation allows the entire care team see the most up-to-date clinical information available.

6

WRAP UP

I can view information from the patient's visit at follow up. I use my patient worklists and patient stickers to track daily billing or utilize reports I can print.
